

Don't Give Virgil Goode A Free Ride Back to Congress

In the last matchup between Virgil Goode and Al Weed, Mr. Goode received three votes for every one that Mr. Weed received. The Republicans would love to run against Al Weed again!

There are three issue on which Karl Rove and Virgil Goode are going to give Al Weed his fifth loss in five runs for public office: Immigration, Jobs and Economic Development, and Gay marriage.

ONE: Immigration

You don't need a crystal ball to figure out that the Republicans and Mr. Goode are going to use immigration to drive a wedge between Democrats, Independents, and moderate Republicans.

They will be quick to point out that employers who use immigrant labor, because it is cheaper than American labor, are driving wages and opportunity down for all working Americans.

If Al Weed is part of the problem on immigration it will weaken his support among Democrats and will drive voter turnout down! Without strong and enthusiastic Democratic support, Mr. Weed will not stand a chance against Mr. Goode.

Two: Redefining marriage:

Americans have two competing considerations on the issue of Gay Marriage:
